Under the phase-in provision in the Assessment Act, an increase in assessed value is introduced gradually. A decrease in assessed value will be introduced immediately. The January 1, 2016 assessed value and classification of your property will be used as the basis for calculating your 2019 to 2020 property taxes, as illustrated below.


